Dear MSLF Supporters:

Now in our 17th year, the Massachusetts Soldiers Legacy Fund (MSLF) continues the pursuit of our goal to honor the sacrifice of service members and their families through education. What began as a college project in 2004 has blossomed into a movement that has had a massive impact on the lives of so many children growing up within a bereaved military family.

2020 was certainly a trying year for everyone globally, and the education space had to adjust dramatically to make improvements in order to handle the changes resulting from COVID-19. Remote schooling became the norm, with many children attending college classes from home, and many MSLF beneficiary families having to make do in this difficult time. Luckily, we were able to help many of these families through this transition. Over the past year, we have continuously looked for opportunities to help our families and support their education-focused needs during the current pandemic. Whether it was upgrading our students' computers, providing grants for e-learning opportunities, or helping with certifications, we thought outside the box as an organization and continued to deliver on our mission to support education.

Since inception, the MSLF has provided nearly \$2.5 million in education focused grants to the children of fallen heroes from Massachusetts. In 2020 alone, we disbursed nearly \$443,000 worth of these grants to over 50 families. At the conclusion of 2020, 86 children were eligible to receive funding from the MSLF. The average age of eligible child is 18 years old with 47 children between the ages of 14 and 22. We currently have 16 MSLF beneficiaries enrolled in college. Additionally, we have many MSLF beneficiaries that have graduated from college and now have rewarding careers, some even have growing families of their own.

Our mission remains long-term and with your generous support, the MSLF will continue to have a meaningful impact on the lives of our eligible beneficiaries. Together, we have accomplished much, but we still have many miles to go in our mission. Thank you for your steadfast support and assuring MSLF families that their tremendous sacrifice will always be remembered.



MSLF MISSION

The Massachusetts Soldiers Legacy Fund is a charitable trust that seeks to honor Massachusetts Fallen Servicemen and Servicewomen, who died while supporting military operations post 9/11, by providing educational assistance grants to their children.

Children qualify if their parent in the military died supporting the global war on terrorism and whose death was credited to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. There is no selection process. If the child is a son or daughter of a Serviceman or Woman whose service is credited to Massachusetts and gave his/her life in support of the Global War on Terror, that child then qualifies for funds. To date, over 175 Servicemembers from Massachusetts have died. Of these casualties, 52 were parents who left behind a total of 86 children, ranging in age from two years old to thirty years of age. All of these children are now eligible to receive funding through the MSLF program.

All contributions to the MSLF are collected and pooled together in an investment account that is managed on a pro-bono basis by GW & Wade Asset Management in Wellesley, MA. In an effort to preserve donor contributions, the MSLF Board of Trustees has adopted an investment strategy with low market risk.
